January - Pylon racing with Micros and Slow Sticks. One lap on the ground five in the air.

We had fifteen

February- Delta Darts, distance and duration. The rules are the same for both events. The AMA Delta Dart can be modified but you can only use the components that are furnished in the kit. Trim flights from eleven fifteen to eleven thirty. Both events will be a mass launch from

the flight line and the first event will start promptly at eleven thirty. **Distance** – the longest distance from the flight line wins. **Duration**- the last one down wins.

Vice President: Dave West briefly discussed the new meeting format. After conducting the business portion of the meeting, there were be a brief break followed by a presentation. It is hoped many of our members can participate by sharing both experiences and skills.

It was also hoped to have a brief presentation on new and different types of glues at each meeting followed by members “best crash” stories. The best of which would win the glue!

COMMITTEES

Fun Flies – Ron Hilger said due to the proposed Fun Fly budget changes there wouldn’t be food at the next Fun Fly. The event would be a repeat of the December micro pylon races followed by a slow stick pylon race.

Safety – Tom Lyons was absent.

Flight Instruction – John Howe had nothing new to report.

OTHER BUSINESS

Budget – It was intended to vote on the proposed 2011 budget, however, in Bob Elsner’s absence, it was decided to defer until the next meeting. It was pointed out that due

to reduced income from events, money for food and prizes at fun fly’s had been reduced.

Board Elections – Officers were elected at the November meeting, but the task of filling the open positions in the Board remained. One Board position was automatically filled per the by-laws by retiring President **Mert Mischnick**. Remaining Board positions included the committee chairpersons and three Board positions at large. The current committee chairs consisting of **John Howe** for Flight Instruction, **Ron Hilger** for Dome Fun Fly Chairman, **Scott Stampfli** for Outdoor Fun Fly Chairman, and **Tom Lyons** for Safety Officer were nominated without contest to continue their positions. A motion was made to approve the four committee chairpersons as a group, was seconded, and passed by the members.

Nominations were taken for the remaining three positions. Member nominations included **Glen LaRocco, Orville Fluharty, John Kubitz, Bob Sarley, Jeff Peca, and Stan Warden**. A written ballot was cast resulting in **Glen LaRocco, Jeff Peca, and Stan Warden** assuming the remaining Board positions. Thanks to all for your participation!

Dome eNiter – Stan Warden said he had volunteer sign-up sheets for the January 15th Dome eNiter. The raffle will be for a 7 channel Futaba 2.4 Ghz radio system.

A number of new things will be tried at the next event to help encourage public participation. These include buddy box flying, flight simulator, in dome AMA sign up, micro flying on the putting green, and micro pylon racing. Also new pilots can fly free from 4am to 6am. We are also one of the few indoor facilities that continue to support 72 mhz transmitters. Input will be solicited from participants to help improve the event further in the future.

April Swap – John Howe reported that the 2011 Swap would be held in the “regular” building of the DuPage Fairgrounds on

Saturday April 23rd. There will be a Friday setup. Swap Flyers are available for distribution and the event has been posted on the AMA website.

ENTERTAINMENT

Dave West introduced **John Howe and Jeff Peca** as our guest speakers at this evenings meeting. John and Jeff discussed the process for making fiberglass items using molds. Two Ziroli molds purchased at the last Swap were used for the demonstration. Items discussed were different types and weights of fiber glass, "release" agents for the molds, polyester versus epoxy resins, glassing techniques, and joining parts. A great presentation!

PLANES

Marty Schrader showed the club his Ultimate Foamie. This is a three-channel plane. It initially flew poorly until he found the proper CG placement.

Willie Cowgill showed the club his F-22 Raptor built from plans. It is powered by a 400 size motor on a 1500 ma battery pack. He used water based Rustoleum for color.

Dave West showed the club a modified version of the twin fan powered jet he won in the raffle. He made a modification to move the engines from the bottom of the wing to the top of the fuselage. This was done to prevent tearing off the engines when landing without wheels. It now looks a bit like a Honda Jet.

Another member (sorry didn't catch the name) showed the club his Bipy. A small foam plans built biplane. It flies well but still needs some tweaking.

Art Wojda took home the tools door prize, **Bill Cowgill** won a 2011 calendar, and **Katie Howe** won the drill guide. **Tom Jacobs** was the Turkey winner and the rollover, rolled over.

While stand-alone systems have been available for awhile, only recently have radio manufacturers started integrating telemetry into R/C systems. At the February meeting we will take a hands-on look at the Spektrum DX8 and the Hitec

Aurora 9. If you own another telemetry system, bring it along. We can discuss different equipment and approaches.

The “glue of the month” for February is Ambroid – the glue of choice for modelers from the 1940's through about 1980. (I still remember chewing it off my fingers.) Someone will go home with a fresh tube!
